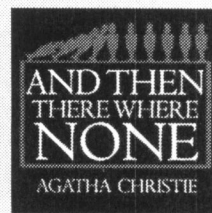
AIM:

to invent or develop (a plan, story, etc.) especially in order to trick or deceive someone

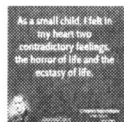

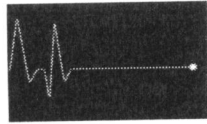
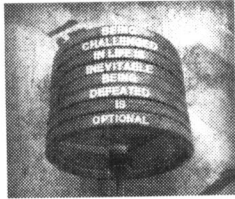

incapable of being avoided or evaded

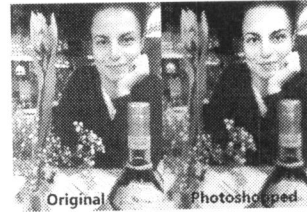

deriving pleasure from inflicting pain, suffering, or humiliation on others



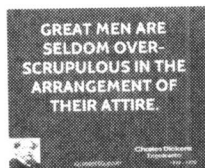
